

How to always win at Shogi (Chess)

No matter how strong your opponent is, even a professional master, you'll be guaranteed to win. (Even chess)

In order to engage in psychological warfare, you'll need to play in real life.



How do you beat an overwhelmingly strong opponent?

(1) Off-board strategy

Make yourself look weak and lure your opponent into letting their guard down. However, this strategy won't be effective enough to overcome an overwhelming difference in strength.

A great detective teaches you a sure-fire strategy for winning at shogi.

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(2) Bring in AI Weapons

(3) Fight on a Field Where Your Army Has an Advantage

By making good use of the terrain,

it's possible to overcome overwhelming differences in military strength.

It's said that it takes three times the military strength to capture a fort.

So, build a fort in advance and set traps.

Use psychological warfare to lure the enemy to that location.

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
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How to always win at Shogi (Chess)

Just before the game begins,

"Just to confirm, we'll play a single match under [no handicap standard rules](#), okay?"

When it's your turn, "You're already in checkmate"



You take your opponent's king
and place your king in its place.



"I won by spherical move permitted
under [no handicap standard rules](#) defined by [World Shogi Association](#)"

Just before the game begins, you chant the following spell.

"Just to confirm, we'll play a single match under no handicap standard rules, okay?"

When it's your turn, chant the following spell.

"You're already in checkmate".

You take your opponent's king and place your king in its place.


"I won by spherical move permitted under no handicap standard rules defined by World Shogi Association".

This is an important spell, so chant it many times.

How to always win at Shogi (Chess)

"Japan Shogi Association doesn't have no handicap standard rules, but [World Shogi Association](#) does".

"If you're in doubt, try searching the web".



"The board may appear flat, but if you think of it as a sphere, both ends are connected. It's also known as [space shogi](#)".

"The tactic of backing up own king and capturing the opponent's king is permitted by the rules".

"You lost because you didn't check the rules. I don't want to hear your excuses".

"Japan Shogi Association doesn't have no handicap standard rules, but World Shogi Association does".

"If you're in doubt, try searching the web".

"You checked the rules beforehand, right?"

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
"You lost because you didn't check the rules. I don't want to hear your excuses".

Continue chanting until your opponent is incapacitated, and you'll win completely.

How to always win at Shogi (Chess)

Let's establish a World Shogi Association in advance.

Let's create a website explaining the “no handicap standard rules“.



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It would be great if someone could actually create one.

From the global perspective, Japanese shogi masters are like frogs in a well.

Japan has local rules such as age limits, and players are only strong under those rules.

The strongest professional is not necessarily the strongest in Japan.

In amateur tournaments, everyone is eligible to participate, so the winner is the true best in Japan.
